The program tonight was with Heather Lofstrom and her many quilt trunk show.

The business Meeting was called to order at 8:14pm. We have a Quorum. There were no additions or corrections to the Newsletter or the Treasurer's reports so were filed for audit.

Unfinished Business:

Suggestion Box from last month asked that maybe 3 or 4 people could bring snacks to each meeting. We had tried this before and decided people could bring what they wanted to bring whenever. This will be discussed at the next board meeting for further suggestions. Also, in the Box somebody suggested we have something new like a tip of the day for new quilters to learn from. We thought it might be easier for a tip or two to be put in the Newsletter than to have a volunteer find and organize the tips. Of course, that would fall on the "New" Newsletter Editor's workload. If the suggestion person would like to submit a tip each month, by looking online for something, that would also be a learning process for them too.

SSQ Quilt Show: We will have a booth to sell our goods both days – March 22-23 and have members manning the booth both days. Thank you for volunteering.

New Business:

The Guild Quilt Challenge will be due in June so there is plenty of time to make one. \$8 for each fabric pack with the instructions enclosed. →

Board Members for 2019-2020 needed in order to continue the Guild are the Secretary and the Treasurer. Nobody volunteered so it will be asked again later in the meeting.

The New Budget was balanced at the Board meeting Thursday last, was presented and voted on.

Committee Reports:

Quilted Comforts will have a work day soon. Plenty of kits to pick up and sew.

Barnes & Noble – Jenni still needs volunteers to pass out bookmarks on April 4th. It is only one day and nothing to sell! These are only two-hour shifts.
