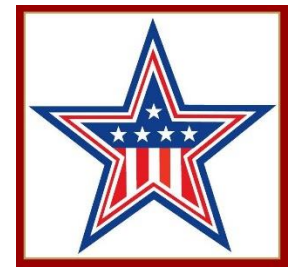

Apple Fest was cancelled because of forecast rain and wind conditions. We will be looking for other venues to make up for it. One will be the Fruita Craft Show where Gina Gust is going to share part of her table with us. A couple of members volunteered to help. Other venues will be discussed.

NEW Business:

Reference the SSQ/CWQG Get Together, Yolanda took the idea to her board meeting and they have invited us to their Christmas Party on December 12th. An official invitation will be forthcoming.

Fundraising Ideas: Cookbooks, Silent Auction, and Karen Holt spoke about a charity basket idea she knew about that a Utah group did for a fund raiser. Groups made them up then held a silent auction for them. We would do it on a smaller scale.

Committee Reports:

BOM – Debbie – will have a drawing for anyone who purchases a pattern and one for the winner of the blocks that are turned in.

Membership: We now have 69 members and because of a glitch at the printers, the membership booklets will now be ready for next meeting.

Books/Scraps/Magazines: Kathy Rhoades has an injured leg and did not attend tonight. Kathy will be back next month.

Quilted Comforts – Karen Larsen has more squares to make 9 patch blocks, and also said the food bank which

we sponsor needs Gluten free food as well as baby food, diapers, peanut butter, and personal care items like lotions, shampoos, deodorant, etc.

Retreat: Bonnie Huisjen said the retreat is the same as last year – dates November 2-4 at the Grand Vista Hotel. \$30.00 a day and inexpensive room rates for those staying over. Bring a \$20-25 sacked gift so that everyone goes home with one. Guests are welcome.

Barnes and Noble – Jenni Stansberry said This winter Book Fair is December 1. For "Transitions" we still need blankets for their patients. No bindings. About 36 x 36.

Programs: On November 14 Annie Unrein will be speaking on the differences between Soft and Stable and other similar products. On November 15, Annie will teach the "Catch-All Caddy". This is a great bag for classes and organizing your quilting. The Class fee is \$60.00 and lunch is included. Pattern \$10.00.

In December we will have our Christmas Party, which will be Pot Luck. We will also have games. Instead of underwear for Salvation Army, we encourage you to bring food for the Food Bank (or personal care items). The Program for tonight was "Anatomy of a Challenge" with Mary Kerr for our speaker.

The Next Board Meeting will be November 8 and the next Guild meeting will be November 14. The Church will get back to Chris in a couple of days to verify the December meeting date. In past years we have had to hold the meeting on a Thursday.

We had Show and Tell and prize drawings for Name that Block, BOM and Membership name tags. Also, a drawing was held for the donation of Venue Sales items. Congratulations Susan Aldeman.

UFO prizes will be awarded at the December meeting so finish up any UFO's you have by the November meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm.
