The CWQG Board meeting was called to order by President Chris O'Grady at 5:58 pm. There were no additions or corrections to the Minutes of the last meeting or to the Treasurers report so were filed for audit. Those in attendance were: Chris O'Grady, Marsha Root, Brenda Bloemke, Bea Root, Sheila Symanski, Kathy Lisco, Michielle Schlichenmayer, Mary Hussman, Betty Reed, Nicki Johnson, Gini Bright and Eddy Davis.

### Committee Reports:

1<sup>st</sup> VP: Marsha said the SSQ Quilt Show proceeds were \$1200. Thank you to all who contributed and worked the venue.

2<sup>nd</sup> VP Membership: Bea said we have 75 members.

3<sup>rd</sup> VP Programs: The May meeting has an order change. We will have our business meeting first with the installation of officers then the Dana Ramsey trunk show then drawings and show and tell after the program.

Treasurer: Mary said the 2019-2020 budget was approved at the last meeting.

### Unfinished Business/Discussion

Suggestion Box ideas mentioned snacks for the meetings. Gini Bright said she had read in other guild newsletters, that each member attending would donate 25 cents at each meeting to pay for them. Depending on how many attended (30 members would raise \$7.50, 40 members \$10.00!) that could pay for ingredients for baking cookies so no out-of-pocket expense. We would still need volunteers to bake them. More suggestions are welcome. It will be brought up to the membership at the general meeting.

Eddy Davis displayed the prototype for some new quilt display racks for the Challenge Quilt and for venues. She said the cost for each is approximately \$63 and we would need 4 racks to replace the broken metal ones we now have.

A discussion was made about re-joining with CQC. A lot goes on we don't hear about and the \$25.00 is a small price to pay. Mary will send in the paperwork as soon as A new g-mail address is obtained.

The next Board meeting will be May 2 at 6pm and the next General Meeting will be May 8 at 7pm.
